**Scope and Content Note:** The collection consists of the records of the Barnstable Village Civic Association and the renamed Barnstable Village Association, including bylaws, meetings agendas and minutes, membership records, and other documents from 1987 through 2019. Records are incomplete. This is an open collection.

**Historical and Biographical Information:** The Barnstable Village Civic Association (BVCA) was founded in the late 1950s. According to their bylaws, “the BVCA represents the people of Barnstable Village and Cummaquid in working for the betterment of the community, fosters and promotes communication, perpetuates good relationships with residents of the Town of Barnstable, other village and civic associations and town officials, is a collective forum to discuss issues and topics of interest and import to the residents.” For a short time circa there was also a Barnstable Village Business Association (BVBA). In 2012/2013 the BVCA and BVBA merged to form the Barnstable Village Association (BVA.)
